Research paper is assessed on the 1-10 grade scale: - Max 8 points for the proper preparation of research work and the content of it (fulfilling the methodological requirements, coherent and proper scientific language, balance of structural parts, relevancy, consistency, validity, thoroughness, etc.). - Max 2 points for the presentation of the research work and it's defence (clearness, constructiveness, conciseness, adhesive scientific language, etc.) and answering to questions.
