Purpose of the course unit: programme competences to be developed

The course unit aims at providing in-depth knowledge about the main principles and particularities of EU external relations law, legal and institutional mechanisms for establishing and maintaining the EU's external relations with third parties in the global world, the relationship between EU and international law; developing the ability to systemically analyse the main legal and policy features of the Common Commercial Policy (CCP), Development Policy, Common Foreign and Security and Defence Policies, EU Neighbourhood and Enlargement policies, to critically interpret key provisions of the EU Treaties and the case law of the European Court of Justice related to the EU external relations, along with relevant international agreements, EU secondary legislation and policy documents. Besides an in-depth legal perspective, it will offer an insight into a wider policy context for a better understanding of the phenomenon of European integration in the area of external relations. Students will also develop interpersonal and communication skills.

Active participation during seminars	20	During the seminars	During the seminars, selective legal problems will be discussed and case studies solved. The case studies shall be presented before the seminar providing some time for preparation of their solutions. It will be evaluated the providing of correct answers to questions, formulating problems and suggesting (searching for) solutions, offering thoughtful critical remarks, contributing to other participants' ideas, etc.
Presentation	30	During the seminars	A power point presentation of 15-20 minutes followed by Questions and Answers session. Students will be able to choose their own topic or one from the list of suggested topics on EU external relations law. Assessment consists of: - presentation content (comprehensive problem analysis, proper identification and presentation of sources, critical/analytical thinking, formulation of conclusions and recommendations); - presentation form and structure (concentrated work presentation, adequate scientific language, use of informative visual aids).
Examination	50	At the end of the course	A written exam will consist of several case studies. EU Treaties and other legal acts may be used during the exam. When answering, students should provide all the necessary information in an well-reasoned, coherent and clear manner.
