where there are no established regulation or existing legal precedents. The course unit also aims at developing the						
competence to carry out an individual research: to identify, analyze and solve complex legal problems of both law						
making and application of law in the field of international and European law.

Participation in class activities	10	During the semester	Students will be expected to demonstrate both the knowledge gained during the course as well as their abilities to apply it in a given situation. Assessment of participation in class activities consists of participation in discussions during lectures and seminars (capability to provide correct answers to questions, formulate problems and suggest (search for) solutions, offer thoughtful critical remarks, contribute to other participants' ideas).	
Preparation of individual research paper	60	During the semester	 Every student will have to prepare an individual research paper. The research projects will have to cover topics discussed during the class activities. The topic of the research project is subject to the approval of the coordinator. The maximum number of points that may be received for the written paper is 6 (i.e. 6 points out of the final grade, which is 10 points). The evaluation of the paper will be based on: Up to 3 point for work content (comprehensive global law problem analysis, proper legal sources application, critical analytical thinking, clear and argumentative conclusion/recommendation formulation); Up to 2 point for work structure and style (clear structural parts, scientific language style, exact wording, source references, proper and ethical citation use); Up to 1 point for demonstration of broad and in-depth knowledge of the topics which will be discussed during the class. 	
Presentation and defense of individual research paper	30	At the end of the course	 Every student will have to present their individual research papers The maximum number of points that may be received for the presentation of the paper is 3 (i.e. 3 points out of the final grade, which is 10 points). The evaluation of the presentation will be based on: Up to 2 points for work presentation (concentrated work presentation, adhesive scientific language, the use of informative visual aids); Up to 1 point for efficient and active participation in discussion, answering to questions, contribution to other participants' ideas.
