

UNDERSTANDING HUMANITARIAN ACTION:

FINDING THE SPACE

12th November, 2013 - Vilnius

Lithuania holds the Presidency of the Council of the European Union during the second semester of 2013. The rotating Presidency is an opportunity to test country's competence and its reliability. It offers a great opportunity to increase the role and weight of civil society in the decision making process and strengthen citizenship.

Together with the Faculty of Law at Vilnius University, the Network on Humanitarian Action (NOHA), organises an awareness raising seminar to discuss the challenges and scope of international humanitarian action, its potential and requirements. The main aim of the seminar is to raise public awareness on Lithuanian civil society, the NGO sector, media and government institutions about humanitarian action globally, at the European level, and regionally (in particular the Baltic region) focusing on challenges, requirements and opportunities for international humanitarian action.

The conference will focus on issues relevant to finding a space for potential new humanitarian aid actors in international humanitarian action and on possibilities for building regional capacity.
